


Technology Courses

Improving computer skills, learning how to use a tablet and staying safe online







At the Adult Learning and Skills Service we have a range of computing and tablet courses to update your computing skills whether it is for work, to gain or improve your skills or a leisure interest. The length of each course is based on two contact hours per week plus individual study time.

What courses and workshops are on offer?

1 Introduction to computers – start here if you are completely new to computers. This course can take up to 12 weeks to complete.

2 Award in digital skills entry

3 BCS – you can progress to the award once you have completed our introduction to computers course. This is an entry level accredited course, you will receive a certificate upon completion. This course can take up to 15 weeks to complete.

3 Subject specific courses – will prepare you for progressing onto a recognised ECDL qualification.

These preparation courses include: introduction to word processing, introduction to Excel and introduction to PowerPoint. Each course can take up to 3 weeks to complete.

ECDL in IT user skills certificate level 1 BCS

This course is ideal if you have reasonable computer skills and would like to learn more and gain a recognised IT qualification. These courses run for 38/39 weeks of the year, so you can join a course at various intervals throughout the year and progress at your own pace. This course can take around 17 weeks to complete.

ECDL in IT user skills certificate level 2 BCS

The level 2 certificate confirms and demonstrates your competent use of computers that potential employers are looking for. You should have completed the BCS ECDL level 1 certificate in IT user skills or demonstrate a comparable level 1 qualification. These courses run for 38/39 weeks of the year, so you can join a course at various intervals throughout the year and progress at your own pace. This course can take around 29 weeks to complete.

Bespoke courses



Funding options

Age 19+?

Earn less than £15,736.50 per year?

You could study a level 1 or level 2 course for FREE



*You may be fully funded if you are employed and cannot contribute towards the cost of co-funding fees. You must meet both of the following:

- Eligible for co-funding, and
- Earn less than £15,736.50 annual gross salary.

Evidence of your gross annual wages is required i.e. a wage slip within 3 months of your start date, or a current employment contract that states gross monthly/annual wages.
